

# The ROT13 Cipher

ROT13 means "rotate by 13 places", and is sometimes hyphenated as ROT-13. It is a letter substitution cipher that replaces each letter with the corresponding letter that is 13 letters after or before it in the alphabet.

ROT13, in the basic Latin alphabet, is reversible. To undo ROT13, simply apply the substitution again, i.e. the same action can be used for encoding and decoding.

In the following chart, simply look up the character in the chart and substitute the corresponding character from the other line. Numbers, symbols, whitespace, and all other characters are left unchanged.
